

Subject Finding Aid

The following index is a general finding aid developed to guide the researcher through the Randolph County Archives of Oral History. Currently, the finding aid is rather general. It is our hope that volunteers can help to sharpen the focus with time. Each number listed below refers to a file and tape number in the collection. Files labeled “**OH**” mark oral history interviews. File labeled “**OHS**” indicate that they are housed in the oral history collection but are sociology interviews and papers. Each file should contain a Tape Log to further guide the researcher on their quest to understand our unique corner of Arkansas. Researchers can compare file numbers in this finding aid with the “File Numbers” to determine if tapes for these interviews exist as well as learn the name of the interviewer, interviewee, and the general focus of the interview.
